

The ***Baker Street Irregulars Trust*** is dedicated to collecting, preserving and making available for study all those materials pertaining to the history and activities of the Baker Street Irregulars.

The archive assembled by the Trust, will be housed, catalogued and maintained as a Special Collection at the Houghton Library of Harvard College. It will be available to scholars and devotees of Sherlock Holmes for examination and study.

The Trust is actively seeking material not only to make its archive accurate and complete but also to capture the spirit of the Baker Street Irregulars literary society and its distinguished members. The following items are of interest:

1. BSI functions – papers, toasts, musical interludes, "Stand With Me", tapes, poems, and pictures.
2. BSI Silver Blazes – material for example, 2000 & 2003 Saratoga
3. BSIT "Field Trips" – for example, the Valley of Fear Expedition
4. BSI Manuscript Series – correspondence and manuscripts
5. BSI History Series – correspondence and manuscripts
6. Distinguished Speakers – their lecture papers
7. BSI International Series – correspondence and manuscripts
8. Correspondence – between any parties where the subject pertains to the Baker Street Irregulars, or correspondence that offers insight into individuals who were members of the Baker Street Irregulars.
9. BSI artifacts – Edgar's cottage nameplate; Sherlock Holmes bust; Edgar's light switch plate; gavel presented to Edgar from Six Napoleons.
10. Baker Street Journals – journals that have some interesting provenance.
11. Baker Street Irregulars' business papers – meeting notices, letters to members, meeting minutes, etc.
12. Baker Street Journal – Editors' files, correspondence, manuscripts.
